- Mr. Ward gave a sales update on gallons and revenue.
- Mr. Ward informed the commissioners that they are still working on finalizing permits for Dogwood Estates and hope to start in late fall. We are waiting for a permit from DES to complete the line on Logan Rd. Horse Creek Academy is in the process of working on some punch list items. We have been in discussions with the developers on two subdivisions on Hermitage Pond Rd.
- Mr. Ward informed the commissioners that they are waiting on a quote for the Jockey Pump at Spring Hill Booster Pump Station. We are also working on replacing the Booster Pump Station at Singleton Creek. We have removed and rehabbed the tank at Boonetown and have set it up at the Flat Rock Tank. We are hoping for it to be online by the end of the week. We also have a new PLC coming for our 521 Booster Pump Station, to help our pumps alternate correctly.
- Mr. Ward updated the commissioners on the Pierre trial, as of now we have a trial date for the week of January 26, 2026, at Kershaw County Court House.
- Mr. Ward informed the commissioners that we have a new Field Technician that started today.
- Mr. Ward informed the commissioners that we submitted the grant application on September 11, 2025. This grant will be for 1.5 million to extend the water line from Rogers Road to Logan Road.



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- Mr. Ward informed the commissioners that he had reached out to Daniel concerning the Board Appointments and asked him to confirm that the applications had been received by the Governor's office. As of now we are still waiting on Derrick Brown and Furman Fountain.
- Mr. Ward stated that AECOM is doing some fieldwork with Lynchburg, and we have not received anything from the town on the draft contract.
